Local Scholarships 2019

The local scholarships typically range from \$100 to \$5,000. These scholarships are only available to graduating Milford seniors. The student is eligible if they are attending a 2-4yr college or entering a trade program. Additional scholarships that do not require applications are also awarded each year. Each scholarship has different criteria and there are special categories such as fine arts, engineering, community service, and youth sports. **Scholarships will be presented with department and superlative awards during the Senior Awards Night on Thursday, April 25, 2019. You must attend in order to receive the scholarship. You will not be notified in advanced of the award you have received. Invitations will be mailed to award recipients during the second week of April. You are required to RSVP for this event.** GPA Awards are recognized at Graduation, not at Senior Awards.

Scholarships are not funded by Milford Schools. If, for any reason, the award money is not disbursed to the recipient Milford Schools is not responsible for the amount. Students should contact the scholarship organization directly. Additionally, after reviewing the applications, the sponsors may choose not to award a scholarship or may change the award amount.

Instructions for Applying: A 5-step Process

Step 1: Obtain an official transcript from the guidance office. Do this early; Last day requests will not be accommodated. (Senior transcripts may also be passed out with the Q2 Report Cards during homeroom.)

Make a copy for each scholarship for which you plan to apply. You are responsible for making copies. The Guidance office will not do this for you.

Step 2: Fill out **FORM A**. You may copy Form A into a word doc to type or neatly hand-write the information. **Print a copy of Form A for each scholarship for which you are applying.** If you have trouble, please make arrangements with Mrs. Schunk (D25) or Mrs. Willson (B12) to get help. Last day requests will not be accommodated.

Step 3: Complete "Information Specific to a Scholarship" for all the scholarships for which you are applying. Note if you are completing the document electronically, page numbers and formatting may appear differently on different screens. It is up to you to make sure the pages you need are properly formatted and all necessary pages are included.

Step 4: Arrange each scholarship application into a **stapled packet in this order:** (do not use Paper Clips)

- (top) Information Specific to a Scholarship (Signed at the bottom) and any additional required materials (ex. essay questions)
- (middle) FORM A
- (bottom) A copy of your transcript
- (optional – last) Any Additional Materials/Documentation you would like to include

Review each application one more time. If your application is faulty or incomplete you will not have a chance to revise. You may be disqualified from the judging for each incomplete or incorrect application.

Step 5: Return the individual, stapled applications to Mrs. Schunk in room D25 any time before 2:20 p.m. on Tuesday, January 22, 2019. There will be a file system set up in the classroom to submit your application to the correct sponsor folder. If you will be absent, please submit your applications before Friday 1/18. You may also leave them with a secretary in the main office. **Late applications will not be accepted. No Exception.**

The budget of Boyd E. Smith Elementary PTO allows for the award a \$500 scholarship to students in the Milford Exempted School District pursuing higher education.

3. Latest official school transcripts of grades

(Four \$500 non-renewable scholarships)

Central Committee is comprised of Milford School administrators and parent representatives from each of the eight PTA, and PTO organizations, meeting regularly to promote mutual friendship and understanding, cooperate on projects and interests affecting the district, and maintain lines of communication between administration and the parent support groups. Through cooperative volunteerism, the parent groups provide services and funds to meet a variety of Milford student school needs.

Criteria:

1. The student must attend a two or four year post-secondary education program next year.
2. The student must have a minimum of a 2.5 GPA.
3. School and community service will be the most important consideration in the selection process.
4. The student must agree to the terms of this scholarship as stated and sign this application.
5. Applications deemed incomplete will be discarded.

Instructions:

1. Read and sign the terms stated on this application.
2. Read all questions in the Personal Information section and then **answer the questions on a separate paper.**
3. Obtain a letter of recommendation from a teacher, coach, employer, pastor, or other non-family adult.
4. Submit your written responses, and the letter of recommendation to the senior faculty advisor at the high school prior to the scholarship deadline.

All applications will be reviewed by the Central Committee Scholarship Committee. Finalists will be contacted for an interview, and scholarships will be presented at Senior Awards Night.

Charity was a Youth, High School, and Private Club soccer player. She also served as Class Officer, Student Council member, tutored elementary students, and participated in Drama and Show Choir. She was extraordinarily dedicated to these programs and activities. Charity worked at the school Day Care program; she loved working with children. Her life was filled with family and friends who all remember her huge smile and silly giggle. She died in an automobile accident in 1990 at the age of 16. This scholarship award celebrates Charity's care and generosity toward others.

Criteria

- 1 The scholarships will be awarded to current soccer players who are also outstanding citizens.
- 2 Awards will be based upon the applicants' academic records; citizenship, school and outside honors and activities; as well as his/her participation in soccer.
- 3 Soccer ability and achievements are not primary criteria on which the award is based.

- 1 Any current senior student at Milford High School who played soccer and will attend college in the fall.
- 2 The scholarship winners must stay in school for the full academic year or they will forfeit their right to the scholarship.

In June 2013, shortly after his 3rd birthday, Connor passed away after a long hard battle with an extremely aggressive form of Brain Cancer called ATRT. ATRT, (Atypical Teratoid Rabdoid Tumor), are diagnosed in under 40 children per year in the US, and the prognosis for recovery is minimal.

In loving memory of Connor, and to give back to the community that supported him, the Martin family has provided two \$500 scholarships to help in **furthering education in the medical field, social work or pastoral care**, to support other families in similar situations and hopefully one day find a cure for this deadly disease.

- 1 The student must attend a 2 or 4 year accredited college or university with consideration toward an applicant majoring in a field of education.
- 2 The applicant must participate in Milford High School activities, community service, or faith based activities.
- 3 Financial need is considered when awarding this scholarship.
- 4 The recipient must use the award for tuition, room and board, or books.
- 5 A faculty committee will select the recipient of this scholarship.
- 6 **The student should attach a typed, brief essay that addresses the following question: Why do you believe that you are a strong candidate for The Dr. Ray Bauer Memorial Scholarship?**

Dr. Raymond (Ray) Bauer was a principal at Milford High School from 2003 until his death in 2010. He was a remarkable man, a dedicated husband and father, and a caring principal. His educational background includes a Bachelor's Degree in Education from the University of Cincinnati, a Master's Degree in School Administration from U.C., and a Ph. D. in Educational Administration/School Finance from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. As a teacher, Dr. Bauer specialized in Social Studies, History/Geography, and Foreign Studies. In 2008, he was named the Ohio Association of Student Councils' Administrator of the Year. Former, Milford Superintendent Dr. Robert Farrell said, "Ray was a principal where students came first. He always made himself available to students to help them. That's why he became a principal—it was all about the kids. I've never seen a principal have such a personal connection with his students—especially in a school the size of Milford High School. At graduation, he had something nice to say and a hug for each student. He was amazing." Dr. Bauer's experiences in other districts as superintendent, administrator, and teacher prepared him to effectively manage a school with more than 100 employees and more than 1800 students. He made a huge difference at Milford High School and quickly earned the respect of his staff and faculty as well as students.

About the Greater Milford Historical Society: The GREATER MILFORD AREA HISTORICAL SOCIETY, INC began life in 1967 as Old Milford Incorporated when a few business people in the town decided that it was time to emphasize the history of our town. Later, the Society purchased the property at 114 Main Street for use as a small historic museum, using only the second floor and renting the first floor to a lawyer. The collection grew to the point where it could fill the whole building and so the space was remodeled to a historic house museum. In 1983 James Kirgan left his home Promont to the Society in his will. After initial renovations, the Society and its growing collection moved into the mansion at 906 Main Street.

Since the move to Promont House Museum, the Historical Society has made many important accomplishments: a new roof; interior remodel of the historic house to the tenancy dates of its most famous resident, 43rd Governor John M Pattison 1879-1906; restoration of the portico; state-of-the-art heating and cooling system; removal of the exterior lead-based paint and restoration of the outside of the house, including storm windows; repair of the veranda.

In addition to improvements to Promont House Museum, the Society has expanded its historical programs and collaborative initiatives in the community. The GMAHS is especially proud of our Partners-In-Education programs in the Milford schools, an award winning effort of our volunteers, and of the project to record oral histories of local residents.

The GMAHS meets the first Thursday of the month at Municipal Bldg. 745 Center Street in the Harry Hodges Room for a pot luck dinner followed by a presentation on a variety of interesting historical subjects.

Award preference for this \$500 non-renewable scholarship will be given to those students with an expressed interest in historical preservation, world cultures, social studies and/or other related fields.
